Jim Turner was the clear victor in Champs where he went four of five, while David McCoy took runner up over last year's winner Perry Mattson, who finished third. As a consolation, Perry paired with Kristine Sprague to take a first in Champ doubles. David Ekstrom and Jim McLaughlin rounded out the prizewinners with runners up trays.
