AUDUBON INVITATIONAL

FEBRUARY 24 – 28, 2016

Well, they did it again. For the 22nd year the Audubon Country Club held their annual croquet invitational tournament on February 24th to the 28th in sunny but cold Naples, Florida.

Joe Zilligen stepped into the void, and through the loser's side of the ladder met Chuck Perry in the finals. Chuck was not to be denied, and took his first win in this tournament after 21 years.

First flight, also playing on a full-size court, primarily 5's saw Thelma Lyle lead the block, having lost only to Phil Parsons. As the top seed, she needed one win to get to the finals. Defeating Phil Parson in the ladder sent him to the loser's side, where he won oven Clair Flinn to meet Thelma again in the finals. This time he was successful in besting Thelma to take the title 14-10

Second flight saw undefeated Larry Lammert the block winner, and the recipient of the byes. While Diane Walker was working her way through the ladder to meet Larry, no one was watching Bob Ayers, playing his first tournament, working his way up the loser side. When Diane defeated Larry, who then lost to Bob, it was Bob Ayers and Diane Walker in the final. In last turn a ball through one back set the win for Bob 11-10.

The tournament was capped off with a fantastic Sunday brunch at the club, the trophies were awarded, the good-byes were said, and the players returned home, looking forward to next year.
